Toilet facilities can be found in the vestry of this building

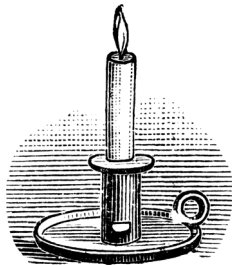
Please make yourself known to the minister after the service especially if you need his services. Contact details of the minister and other personnel can be found on the front page of this order of service.
